



NDSS's Simple Guide to Your Oklahoma License

We know there's a lot to think about when you're getting your driving permit and license. That's why we've gathered all of the steps into one place for you! Print this guide and keep it with you, so you'll be fully prepared when you visit the DMV.

Step 1: Enroll in Your Parent-Taught Driver's Ed Program

You must be at least 15 years old to begin Driver's Ed.

Step 2: Apply for Your Learner's Permit

You must be at least 15 ½ years old to apply for your permit, and you may not begin your behind-the-wheel training until your learner's permit is obtained.

To receive your learner's permit, you'll need to bring:

- Your parent/guardian
- 2 forms of identification (these are usually your birth certificate and social security card)
- Your social security number
- School letter/proof of enrollment or attendance at a secondary or vocational technical school
- Certificate of Enrollment for your Parent-Taught Driver's Education course

At the DPS you'll need to pass a **basic written skills test** and a **vision screening exam**. After that, you'll be issued your learner's permit, and you can begin practicing your behind-the-wheel training!

Step 3: Complete Your Parent-Taught Driver's Ed

Make sure you've completed your **required 55 hours of behind-the-wheel training** with your parent/guardian!

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When you go to apply for your intermediate driver's license, you'll need to take your road skills exam. Here are some requirements you'll need to meet:

- You must have held your permit for a **minimum of 6 months**
- You should bring all of the same documents as with your permit:
 - **2 forms of identification**
 - Your **social security number**
 - **School letter/proof of enrollment**

You'll also want to bring **your learner's permit**, and your **Certificate of Completion** for your Parent-Taught Driver's Ed course.

- Make sure you have the registration and insurance of the vehicle you'll be testing in.
- Bring your parent/guardian!

5. Get Your Intermediate Driver's License!

Once you pass your road skills test, you will be issued your intermediate driver's license, which allows you to drive with a licensed Oklahoma driver over the age of 21, between 5 a.m. and 11 p.m. After you've held your intermediate license for **6 months without incident**, you will receive your **unrestricted driver's license**!

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
